**“Fieldtrip - Cemeteries in Campton”**

Do you know that there are 13 cemeteries in Campton? Find out where they are, and visit some of the lesser known ones on our Cemetery Tour on Saturday, August 21.

Learn where F. Schuyler Mathews, Author and Illustrator is buried, and Henry William Blair, U. S. and State Senator.

Visit the grave of Colonel Samuel Holmes, the benefactor of Holmes Academy, which later became Plymouth State University.

At the Town Farm Cemetery there are unmarked grave stones which possibly could be Colonel Joseph Spencer, an early settler and holder of many town offices is buried, along with Deacon William Baker.

Locate Town Line, and Partridge Hill, and many of the other cemeteries.

Meet at the Campton Historical Society building at 9:00 a.m. We will lead a car-pooling caravan to find some these hidden graveyards. Notes and printed directions to all 13 cemeteries will be provided. Wear comfortable shoes, as we will be walking on uneven ground. Bring a water bottle, and lunch if you would like. The Society Building will be open after the tour.
