The roots of Campton Historical Society began in 1959, when a Historical Committee was organized. It was chaired by Lester Mitchell, from a long term Campton family. The Campton Historical Society was incorporated in 1991 as a 501 ( C )( 3 ) organization. At this time, Articles of Agreement and By-laws were defined, approved, and registered.

Meetings were initially held at the Campton Elementary School. In 1988, the Town of Campton allowed the Society to use the 3 buildings know as the “Old Town Hall” location in Campton Hollow under a 3 year lease. This was replaced by a 99 year lease commencing April 1, 2001. Maintenance, upgrades, and improvements to the buildings are shared by the Town and the Society. The Campton Historical Society has accomplished major preservation and upgrades at the premises, and now has a secure and environmentally proper facility for the storage and display of photos, papers, and artifacts of Campton Area history.

Our mission statement indicates that Campton Historical Society is a non-profit organization dedicated to the following objectives:

- \* To preserve the communities’ heritage through the acquisition and care of artifacts, documents, and other information of historic value, and to make these resources available to others researching our heritage ;
- \*To recognize and protect significant historic structures and sites ;
- \*To serve as an educational resource through public presentations and lectures, printed information, exhibits, and special events,

Meetings are held the 3<sup>rd</sup> Monday of each month except February, March, and December, with programs of general historical interest, and are open to the public. Many special events are also presented, such as the annual Supper and Concert in the Spring in April, Heritage Day in September, and several field trips which are scheduled throughout the year. The buildings are also open at various times for viewing of artifacts of Campton area history on display. Current hours, events, programs, membership, and contacts are displayed in detail on our comprehensive web site at [www.CamptonHistorical.org](http://www.CamptonHistorical.org).

Part of our mission is to answer inquiries from across the country. Our board works closely with the Campton Elementary School on tours and curriculum topics related to the town’s history. And 20 Historic Site Markers have been installed around town, with descriptive brochures available, to help us understand and preserve our heritage.
