The day starts at the Colonel Spencer Inn. Owners and regulars at Campton Historical Events, Scott and Mary Jo Stephens have graciously offered to do tours of their historic inn.

The Colonel Spencer Inn was originally built as a private residence in 1764 by Colonel Joseph Spencer of Connecticut who served in the French and Indian Wars, and was one of the first settlers in this area and one of the charter grantees of the town of Campton.
