Marilyn Wyzga created and coordinates Project HOME, the New Hampshire Fish & Game Department's award-winning schoolyard habitat program. She developed the curriculum guide, *Homes for Wildlife*, and the community training program that has engaged schools in wildlife habitat practices since 1991. Marilyn serves on the board of the New England Environmental Education Alliance and as a committee chair for Wild Ones: Native Plants, Natural Landscapes, a national organization devoted to native plant and landscape restoration. She has applied her design skills to educational exhibits and children's theater, and is currently turning them to landscape design. Marilyn recently co-authored *Integrated Landscaping: Following Nature's Lead*, which offers a new way of thinking about shaping our home grounds and public spaces.
